6. Class strength

Furthermore, teachers have difficulty managing a large number of students in their classes and cannot provide adequate instruction.

There are too many students in each classroom, which causes disruptions and noise during lectures.

There is a breakdown in the process of learning English.

7. Following the wrong syllabus when teaching English

Pakistan's schools, colleges, and universities do not typically have a prescribed curriculum for teaching English.

Teachers must be trained, the curriculum must be appropriate, and the environment must be conducive to learning in order for the study to be effective. Learning is impossible without one of them.

There must be a syllabus for English language learning, or for any other type of education.

8. Parents Don't Encourage

One of the most common problems students face when learning the **English language** is this.

To put it another way, they make them do work for money.

Parents must encourage and support their children to study and learn what they are interested in.
